What is ADI Accreditation?

Ensuring people living with dementia receive high quality care, provided by appropriately trained professionals and carers, is essential to meeting the challenge of dementia. When care is not of sufficient quality, it can have a negative impact for people with dementia, their families and carers.

We aim to support the improvement of care for people with dementia by ensuring a good standard of training and reduce the variations in the quality of care provided, as well as ensure a more focused approach to meeting people's needs through our accreditation programme.



Why have ADI Accreditation?

ADI Accreditation provides a structured approach to the knowledge and skills for participants, as well as establishing standards that providers of the training programmes would need to adhere to.

Through successful completion of an evaluation, participants can earn ADI Accreditation. Accreditation means that the training and learning activities have reached the required ADI standard, ensuring integrity and quality at all levels.

ADI Accreditation is global standards and apply cultural appropriate context to improve global dementia care quality.

Who is eligible to apply?

Both ADI members and non-members of ADI other organisations, such as universities and training colleges, can apply to partake part in the ADI Accreditation Programme.



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The increasing dementia population and key policy indicate a huge demand for the dementia care training in Macau SAR. In effect, Kiang Wu Nursing College (KWNC) of Macau is now able to offer training to nurses for people living with dementia and carers, which is recognised by ADI standards.

How do I apply?

Before you consider whether ADI Accreditation might be right for you, ensure that you and your organisation meets the general eligibility requirements.

Once you have read over the standards and criteria that will be most suitable are appropriate for you, you will need to submit an **eligibility request form**. Following the approval of your request, you and your organisation will then embark on the journey to becoming ADI accredited.
